





As a coach, there's nothing more rewarding than seeing all your hard work finally pay off. And Chagrin Falls Tigers 6th grade coach Jim Pruce is having a lot of those moments lately. "Travis Kruse and I have been coaching together since fourth grade," Pruce explained. "We preach fundamentals and execution. It seems like this year everything is starting to click. We've had moments in the past, but its has been consistent this year."

The Tigers have a core group of five or six girls who hve been together for all three years in Big Leaf and every year one or two girls have been added. Peyton Pruce, Gabriella Byrne and Clarke Perkins lead the rebounding duties for the team. But the floor general of this team is Mol-

ly Wheatley. "Molly handles the ballhandling duties and probably averages 15-20 points per game."

Pruce is quick to give a lot of credit to Olivia Kruse's aunt, Trish Kruse, who is the head coach at Solon High School and has volunteered her time to provide a muchneeded female role model with tremendous knowledge and experience for the girls.

"Everyone knows that this grade is run by Hudson and Mentor, but I feel like we are as close as we could be to competing with the big boys," Pruce reasoned. "Things are just soaking in and it's translating into wins." And, we know coach, that's about as good as it gets!


